- Do something! Utilize a deepened knowledge of history and discerned tools of faith for the current climate to impact a community of which you are a part

Surviving the Times. The single writing project for this course will be the development of a common manifesto -- a common statement meant to help chart a course for organizing around the objective of "surviving the times." This writing process will begin with each student: (20% of grade.)

- Redacting the <u>original 10-Point Plan of the Black Panther Party</u> and <u>The Diary of Anne Frank</u> (i.e., revise and edit it to make it something you could sign). (Due Week 2)
- Writing her/his/their own manifesto. (Due Week 4)
- Responding to the manifesto of other students. (Due Week 6)
- Attempting to develop a common document (with citations). (Due Week 8)
